

How to Apply for Federal Student Aid for the 2009-2010 Academic Year

If you are a United States citizen or a permanent resident of the United States:

- You may apply for federal student loan funds. Students are eligible to borrow federal loan funds in an amount up to the Cost of Attendance *less* any scholarship assistance received from the Clinton School.
- Federal aid recipients must meet certain general eligibility requirements. For more information: <http://studentaid.ed.gov/PORTALSWebApp/students/english/aideligibility.jsp?tab=funding>
- You must be enrolled at least half-time (a minimum of 5 hours) in Clinton School/UALR courses.
- You must complete the 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) in order to receive federal loans funds.
 - If you do not have a federal personal identification number (PIN), you may request one at www.pin.ed.gov
 - When you have your federal pin, apply on-line at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
 - Be sure to complete the **2009-2010** FAFSA application
 - Request your FAFSA data be sent to UALR, federal school code **001101**
- If this is the first federal loan you will receive while attending the Clinton School, you must complete Loan Entrance Counseling. Entrance Counseling is available on-line at <http://mappingyourfuture.org/se>

If you are an International Student:

International students (students who are neither United States Citizens nor eligible non-citizens) ***are not eligible for federal student aid funds.***

- International students may apply for private educational loan funds in an amount up to the Cost of Attendance *less* any scholarship assistance received from the Clinton School.
