

### Eligibility for Summer Pell Grant Awards

- Students may qualify to receive Pell Grant funds if they were enrolled less than full time during the Fall 2010 and/or Spring 2011 semesters and did not use all of their Pell Grant eligibility during the current academic year
- Students may also receive Pell Grant funds during the summer term if they were enrolled full-time during the Fall 2010 and Spring 2011 semesters and have made sufficient academic progress to be eligible for a second Pell Grant award.
- Academic Progress for a second Pell Grant award is defined as completing at least 30 hours
  - The required 30-hour total is calculated using the following formula
$$\begin{array}{r} \text{Hours completed during the Fall 2010 semester} \\ + \text{Hours completed during the Spring 2011 semester} \\ + \text{Hours enrolled and/or completed during the Summer 2011 semester} \\ \hline = \text{Total hours completed} \end{array}$$
  - If the total hours completed equals **at least 31 hours**, the student is eligible for a second Pell Grant in the summer term
  - Changes in summer enrollment, including dropped or withdrawn courses, will affect the total number of hours completed, and therefore impact eligibility for a second Pell Grant award
- In addition to completing at least 31 hours, a student must be enrolled **at least half-time** during the summer term to qualify for a second Pell Grant award

#### Please Note The Following Information About Summer Pell Grant Awards:

- All summer Pell awards should be considered **estimated awards** until Spring 2011 grades are posted on May 20, 2011
- Summer Pell Grant award amounts are adjusted **daily** during the summer semester until the last day of Summer 2011 registration. This means that eligibility for a summer Pell Grant award will be **recalculated each day** until 4:00 PM on Wednesday, July 6, 2011
- Any change in your summer enrollment could affect your eligibility for a summer Pell Grant
