General Rules for Greek Week:

- All participants must be an active brother, sister, or new member in an active fraternity or sorority at UALR. Participants must be listed on the chapter roster to participate in any event. Participants must be currently enrolled in course work at the university.
- All roster updates must be made by **Friday, April 11th, 2008 by 5:00 pm**. No updates will be made after this point in time.
- Participation points will be determined based on the **percentage of active members in attendance, included on each chapter's roster**, present at the requested sign-in times. If it is determined that a team's sign-in sheet has been falsified, that team will be disqualified from the said event. All members **MUST** sign themselves in at each event. Each participant must bring their student ID to each event to verify identification.
- The chosen judges for all events will be the primary judges. **ALL JUDGES DECISIONS ARE FINAL**. If you have questions about a rule or need further interpretation of a rule, please ask and contact the Greek Life Specialist. If there are questions regarding a rule, only 1 representative from each team may approach the Greek Life Specialist.
- There will be no drugs or alcohol at and Greek Week event. Anyone suspected of being under the influence will be asked to leave. Their attendance will not be counted.
- All events begin promptly at their scheduled time. Any chapter not present at state time will have 10 points deducted from their final total. Failure for a team to show up for a scheduled event will result in a loss of all possible points possible for that event.
- Cancellation or postponement of an event due to weather or other circumstances is the domain of the Greek Life Specialist. Notice of such cancellations or postponements will be made directly to each chapter president and on the Greek Life website (www.ualr.edu/greeklife). If no notice is given, each team is to assume the event will still occur.
- All Greek Week participants will sign a copy of the Liability Waiver and Release Form. All completed forms should be turned into the Office of Campus Life prior to Sunday, April 13, 2008. Forms can also be submitted prior to the start time of that event at the event location. No member will participate without the Liability Waiver and Release Form, nor will any member be counted for participation points.
- Any inappropriate behavior against the Greek spirit at UALR viewed by the Greek Life Specialist may result in loss of points, disqualification from the named event, or removal from participation in Greek Week.

Greek Week Alcohol and Substance Policy:

All fraternity and sorority members participating in Greek Week 2008 shall understand that all activities relating to Greek Week are not to involve the possession or consumption of alcohol or illegal substances. The Greek Life Specialist and the Office of Campus Life will have a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY for all events concerning Greek Week for any Greek member, regardless of age. ***Violation of this policy will result in disqualification of the entire pairing of the event in question, or may result in disqualification of the entire pairing from all Greek Week events.***

Greek Week pairings will be subject to disqualification if:

- Alcohol is consumed by any member of the Greek Community at any Greek Week event, beginning on Sunday, April 13 and lasting until Friday, April 18, 2008.
- Any member is in possession of alcohol or other illegal substances at any Greek Week event.
- Any member is observed or cited by law enforcement officials for any alcohol or illegal controlled substance violation at any Greek Week event.
- Any member of any age attends a Greek Week event under the influence of alcohol and/or illegal substances.

All members of the approved chapter roster are to be held responsible for the above chapter policies. All chapters and individuals may be subject to judicial sanctions by the UALR Judicial Affairs officer.

In the event that a member/members of a Greek Week pairing is/are cited for a violation of the alcohol and substance policy as stated above, the pairing's chapter presidents and chapter advisors will be notified.

Liability Waiver & Release Form:

Release of Liability, Waiver of Legal Rights and Assumption of Risk

All Greek Week participants must sign this waiver and return it to the Office of Campus Life prior to the event, or submit it at the time the event is scheduled to begin. All person's not signing the waiver will not be allowed to participate (or be counted for participation points) for that event.

In consideration of being allowed to participate in Greek Week activities sponsored by the UALR Office of Campus Life, I hereby understand and agree to this release of liability, waiver of legal rights, and assumption of risk and to the terms hereof as follows:

1. I acknowledge that Greek Week activities may include action sports and recreational activities and such activities are subject to mishap and even injury to participants, including the potential for permanent paralysis and death. I understand and acknowledge that Greek Week activities have inherent dangers that no amount of care, caution, instruction or expertise can eliminate and I EXPRESSLY AND COLUNTARILY ASSUME ALL RISK OF DEATH OR PERSONAL INJURY SUSTAINED WHILE PARTICIPATING IN GREEK WEEK ACTIVITIES WHETHER OR NOT CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES.

2. I take full responsibility for, RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OFFICE OF CAMPUS LIFE, the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, officers, elected officials, agents and employees from any and all liability, claims, demands or causes of action that I may hereafter have for injuries or damages arising out of my participation in Greek Week activities, included, but not limited to, losses CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES.

I further agree that I WILL NOT SUE OR MAKE CLAIM against the Released parties for damages or other losses sustained as a result of any injury, or death, sustained from my participation in Greek Week activities. I also agree to INDEMNIFY AND HOLD THE RELEASED PARTIES HARMLESS from all claims, judgments and costs including attorney's fees, incurred in connection with any action brought as a result of participation in Greek Week activities by any of the undersigned.

Event Description & Rules

Jar Wars:

Date: Monday, April 14, 2008 until Thursday, April 17, 2008

Time: 10:00 am until 2:00 pm

**Location: DSC Diamond Area & Reynolds Business Building
Atrium**

Event Explanation:

The goal of Jar Wars is to collect as many non-pennies as possible in your container and put as many pennies in everyone else's container. All money collected will be donated to the Greek Week Philanthropy. Remember that the total amount collected will count towards monetary donation points.

Event Specifics:

Each team is responsible for ensuring that the Jar Wars table has one representative present at all times. Teams will not be penalized for non-representation; however, do realize that it puts the unrepresented team at a disadvantage.

Event Rules:

- Each Team will have 1 jar. The jar may be decorated tastefully.
- Jars are due each day (Monday-Thursday) to the Office of Campus Life directly following the end of the designated Jar Wars table times. If a jar is not submitted to the Office of Campus Life by 2:30 pm (ample time to walk across campus) then that team will be disqualified.
- Beginning on Monday, April 14th no individual is to place his or her hand inside of the Jar War container. All Jar War containers have lids, which are to stay in place until the Greek Life Specialist counts the change.

Event Scoring:

Pennies and dollar bills give your team positive points and silver (nickels, dimes, quarters) take points away from your team's total. Here is the point breakdown:

- Pennies = 1 negative point
- Nickel= 5 positive points
- Dime= 10 positive points
- Quarters= 25 positive points
- Half Dollars= 50 positive points
- Dollar Bill/ Coin = 100 positive points

The team with the most positive points will be awarded 75 Greek Week points.

Monetary Donation Solicitations:

Date: Donations for points will be due April 17, 2008

Time: Donation deadline is 5:00 pm (no exceptions).

Location: The Office of Campus Life

Event Explanation:

One of the main purposes of Greek Week is to give back to the community in which we reside. The main way this is accomplished is by monetary collections for Greek Week and donated to a deserving organization in the Little Rock community. This year's charity is the Arkansas Food Bank.

Event Specifics:

Money is to be collected through the individual chapters and then will be tallied together as a team total. Each team will have their total's announced during the Greek Awards program on Friday, April 18, 2008. Also, at the Greek Awards show, a check will be presented to the Greek Week charity, Arkansas Food Bank, for the total amount collected through the week.

Event Rules:

- All donations must be in a sealed envelope marked with the chapter and team name making the donation. This envelope is to be turned in on April 17, 2008 at 5:00 pm to the Office of Campus Life.

Event Scoring:

Each team will receive one (1) point for every dollar that they donate. Additionally, all collections from Jar Wars will be summed and added to that team's donations. In order to receive points, that team must submit donations by 5:00 pm on April 17, 2008. Points will be determined at this point. Any late donations will still be submitted to the Greek Week charity, but will not be used for point's purposes.

Campus Clean-Up:

Date: Sunday, April 13, 2008

Time: 12:00 pm until 3:00 pm

Location: DSC Lower Concourse

Event Explanation:

Giving back to the community is a large part of Greek Life, and what better way to start of Greek Week than doing just that. Students will give back to the UALR community by cleaning up their environment.

Participation points will be awarded for this event, based on the team with the highest consistent participation. Our reasoning for awarding points in this manner is because some people will be coming late due to morning activities, and may be leaving early because of work; therefore, we only thought it fair to judge based on consistent attendance and participation.

Event Explanation:

Let's let the campus know its Greek Week! Teams will paint one highly visible window in the DSC for everyone to see.

Event Specifics:

Window designs must be in good taste, which means suitable for ALL audiences. The Office of Campus Life reserves the right to reject any inappropriate sketch proposal and disqualify any inappropriate windows.

Event Rules:

- Sketches of Artwork must be submitted to the Office of Campus Life for approval on Thursday, April 10, 2008. The person submitting the artwork will receive notification when the artwork has been approved (via e-mail). If a team fails to submit a sketch, then that team is automatically disqualified. Please use the attached form for artwork sketch submission.
- All artwork must be complete by Monday, April 14, 2008 at 12:00 pm. Any window not completed will be disqualified (0 points) from the contest.
- All artwork must meet the following criteria:
 - All team organization(s) names must appear on the window.
 - The Greek Week theme must appear on the window.
 - The words "Greek Week 2008" must be displayed on the window.
- ONLY Provided water-based paints will be used for the window painting. NO Razor blades, NO airbrushes or spray guns, NO tinsel, NO glitter, NO Glue, etc.
- Teams are responsible for any clean-up, such as spills, drips, or other paint not on windows.

Event Scoring:

- Windows will be judged on the following categories:
 - Attractiveness
 - Creativity
 - Promotion of the spirit of Greek unity
 - Use of the Greek Week theme
- The point's breakdown for this event will be:
 - Winner = 75 points
 - 1st place = 50 points
 - 2nd place = 25 point

Event Explanation:

This event will be a time to socialize with fellow Greeks and celebrate the lifelong commitment we have all made to our organizations. BBQ will be provided. There will be music in the commons area for all to enjoy.

Event Specifics:

Team members should wear their Greek Week t-shirts so that a group photo can be taken.

Event Rules:

- A participation signature sheet will be available from 6:00-7:00 pm. All team members in attendance should sign in before 7:00 pm to be counted for participation points.

Event Scoring:

Participation points will be awarded for this event. The breakdown is as follows:

75% team participation = 100 points

50% team participation = 50 points

25% team participation = 25 points

0% participation/nonattendance = 0 points

Capture the Flag:

Date: Tuesday, April 15, 2008

Time: 5:00 pm

Location: Meet at University Commons

Event Explanation:

Each team will have their own territory in which its team members are free to move as they please, but on which opponents enter at their peril. The territories are separate by a boundary line, which will be announced prior to the beginning of the game. Any team member crossing this boundary line may be captured by the enemy.

Each team will assemble close together at a starting point near the center of the boundary line, each team in its own territory. On a signal the teams proceed to set their flags at any point within 200 steps of the starting point. The flags must be visible, although it is permissible to place them as inconspicuously as possible.

After three minutes another signal is given for start of game. The object now is to enter the enemy's territory, capture the flag, and carry it across the line into home territory without being caught. Team members may be posted to guard the flag, but not nearer than 50 steps to it, unless an enemy trespasser goes within the 50-step circle. They may then follow the trespasser.

Any team member found in the enemy's territory may be captured by pulling their personal flag. When a team member is captured that team member must go with captor to the "guard house"- which will be an object at the boundary line, such as a tree or rock.

A prisoner may be released by a team member touching them, provided the prisoner at that time is touching the guard house with a hand or foot, whereupon both return to their own territory. If the rescuer is caught by the guards before he touches the prisoner, he, too, must go to the guard house. A rescuer can rescue only one prisoner at a time.

If the flag is successfully captured, it must be carried across the line into home territory. If the raider is caught before he reaches home, the flag is set up again at the point where it was rescued and the game continues as before. If neither side captures the enemy's flag within the time agreed upon (20 minutes) the game is won by the team with the most prisoners.

Event Specifics:

- **Teams will play in a bracket format. The format is below**
 - **Game 1-**
 - **Team 1 (Chi Omega & Delta Sigma Theta) vs.**
 - **Team 2 (Alpha Phi Alpha, Kappa Sigma, Zeta Phi Beta)**
 - **Game 2-**
 - **Winner of Game 1 vs.**
 - **Team 3 (Omega Psi Phi, Phi Beta Sigma, Pi Beta Phi, Sigma Nu)**
- **Each game will last no longer than 20 minutes.**

Event Rules:

- **Each team must consist of 10 players, no more and no less.**
- **Each team must designate at least 1, but not more than 2, team members to serve as Guards at the Guard House.**
- **Flags must be visible, and may not be placed underneath any objects.**
- **If neither side captures the enemy's flag within the time agreed upon (20 minutes) the game is won by the team with the most prisoners.**
- **All team members are expected to conduct themselves with sportsmanlike conduct. Participants will be allowed one warning for un-sportsmanlike conduct before the Team member is ejected from that tournament. If any team receives three warnings in one game, that TEAM will be disqualified from the event.**
- **Fighting will not be tolerated. If fighting occurs, the penalty for such actions will be immediate disqualification for all parties involved.**

Event Scoring:

The winning team will receive 25 points.

Wesley Lunch:

Location: Wesley Foundation

Event Explanation:

The UALR Greek Community will sponsor the weekly Wesley Foundation lunch on April 16, 2008. This event is open to any individual who is interested in attending.

Event Specifics:

In addition to sponsoring the lunch, the UALR Greeks will have information on Greek Life available to any interested student at the event.

Event Rules:

- None

Event Scoring:

This event will not be scored.

Letter-shirt Competition:

Date: Wednesday, April 16, 2008

Time: 12:00 pm

Location: In front of Student Union A building

Event Explanation:

The letter shirt competition is a visual demonstration of Greek Pride. Letters will be worn to class to increase visibility of Greek Life on campus and pinpoint Greek individuals. The photo taken will potentially be used on the Greek Life website and in Greek publications.

Event Specifics:

Individuals must sign-in for the letter-shirt competition. The sign-in sheet will be compared with the actual photo to determine highest participation.

Event Rules:

- Individuals must be in the photo and signed in to be counted as participants.
- The letters must be from that member's organization and not another organization.
- Letters can be deemed as Block-letter shirts, screen printed t-shirts, or tasteful self-designed shirts. Letters must be worn on the outside and visible to the public.

Greek Quiz Bowl:

Date: Thursday, April 17, 2008

Time: 12:10 pm

Location: DSC Upper Concourse

Event Explanation:

Greek Quiz Bowl will test the knowledge of team members on Greek Facts, UALR Facts, and general trivia.

Event Specifics:

Everyone is welcome to attend this event, however each team will earn points from 3 representatives. Spectators are not allowed to assist the participating members in any trivia questions.

A team captain must be designated and will be seated nearest the moderator. The captain must remain the captain throughout the contest.

The first team to indicate they know the answer will be permitted to attempt an answer first. If they fail to answer the question correctly, the other teams have an opportunity to answer. If no team answers the question correctly, no team will receive points for that question.

If a team is tied, then a series of toss-up questions will be raised until the tie is broken.

Event Rules:

- Each team should have 3 members and 1 alternative to represent their team. An alternative can be substituted at the conclusion of any round. If an alternative enters play, he or she must remain in play for that entire round.
- Team members not serving as a representative may not assist any representative in any trivia questions. Teams will be given 1 warning if team members in the audience become disruptive. After the initial warning, teams may be disqualified for disruptive behavior. Behavior that is considered disruptive may be, but is not limited to: shouting answers, yelling or causing large sums of noise when another team is responding, name calling, using profanity, etc.

Event Scoring:

The winning team will receive 75 points.

Theme Competition:

Date: Thursday, April 17, 2008

Time: 12:10 pm (concurrent with Quiz Bowl)

Location: DSC Upper Concourse

Event Explanation:

This activity provides the teams with an opportunity to display their Greek Spirit! Each team is to compete with each other by creative use of the Greek Week theme, “No Matter Which Way You Go, You Can’t Go Wrong.”

Event Specifics:

Teams may choose to come dressed in the Greek Week theme, display banners or posters with the theme, or other imaginative uses of the theme.

Event Rules:

- Teams are to remember that they are representing the Greek community as a whole in this activity. Displays should be tasteful in nature. Any display should have their team chapter names displayed for identification.

Event Scoring:

Judges will score each chapter on creativity and imaginative use of the theme. The winning team will be awarded 25 points.

Unity Step Show:

Date: Thursday, April 17, 2008

Time: 7:00pm

Location: DSC Fitness Center

Event Explanation:

The highlight of Greek Week is the Annual Unity Step Show. This event provides chapters with the opportunity to work together on their performance, while learning more about a tradition deeply rooted in NPHC organizations history.

Event Specifics:

- The stage consists of a wooden dance floor laid onto of the Fitness Center flooring. The stage floor dimensions are 16ft. x 16 ft. Teams should be prepared to compete in this area. Teams will not be judged on boundaries; however, personal safety should be the team's number one priority.
- There is a 12-minute time limit for each performance.
- Each team must provide a CD of their music. The music must be in the correct sequence.
- Each team must provide one person to instruct the DJ during the performance. If a team is providing smoke or lights, they must also provide someone to operate that equipment.
- The order will be determined before the show with a representative from each team present.

Event Rules:

- Profanity, nudity, obscene gestures, or any unnecessary display on or off the stage, will not be tolerated, and will result in team disqualification.
- If a team member is found to be unsportsmanlike (causing disruption of the show, disrespectful of another organization), that team will be disqualified.
- All competitors must be an active member or new member of a recognized Greek-letter organization at UALR.
- Oils, whip cream, and any other potentially hazardous substances may not be used during the performance, due to safety concerns. Smoke machines and special lighting are permissible, but must be provided at the team's expense. Pyrotechnics (fire devices) will not be allowed.
- Performances exceeding 12 minutes will result in a deduction from the final score (*ten-points per minute exceeded*).
- Time will start when the opening sequence begins(music starts, introduction, skit, etc.)
- If your team is not present at such time as the order is determined, it will be considered a forfeit. * No exceptions.*

The above rules and conditions are final, and failure to comply with any portion of the aforementioned can/will result in disqualification, point deduction, or immediate removal from the premises.

Event Scoring:

The scoring will be on a numeric scale using whole numbers from 1 to 10, with a score of one(1) being the lowest and ten (10) being the highest. Team scores will reflect an average minus the high and low scores. The team with a step show score closest to 100 will receive 225 Greek Week Points.
