Meeting Institutional Challenges

- ◆ Retention is enhanced as students receive evidence-based medical care emphasizing health promotion and disease prevention education.
- ◆ 162 international students from 32 countries were screened for tuberculosis.
- ◆ Influenza prevention initiatives included educational efforts and the annual flu vaccine campaign.
- ◆ Due to an increasing number of students presenting with mental health concerns requiring psychiatric evaluation and care, an updated community referral list was developed. Two of the providers are income-based and one is free for those 18-21 years of age.

A total of 10,659 client care contacts made by Health Services staff.

34% of those tested were positive and required CXR. No active cases of TB were identified.

Over 750 students, faculty, and staff were vaccinated. Both the flu shot and flu mist were offered.

100 % of all students seeking assistance for mental health concerns were provided the updated referral list.
