Barcelona is the second largest city in Spain and the capital of Catalonia. This city is rich in history, architecture as well as cultural and artistic heritage. Because Barcelona is the southern-most port of Europe, there is a unique mixture of culture from the Arabic Peninsula, Roman culture and Christian influence. There are many places to visit and travelers leave Barcelona with a new perspective on European culture.

The southern port allows for a comfortable climate throughout the year. The climate in Barcelona is pretty cool year-round; lows in the winter average about 55 °F and summer highs average about 85 °F.

Abat Oliba CEU is inspired by Catholic traditions—Oliba was a Catholic monk and Bishop of Catalonia from the XI century. The University was named after him to help carry on the spirit of justice, knowledge and the promotion of the Catalanian culture. CEU was established in 1973 and has since graduated more than 8,500 students.

The journalism program at CEU is marked by four distinct characteristics:

2. Training in journalism production
3. Analysis of reality
4. Personalized training

Accommodation

There are several options for living in the university dorms. Expenses can range from \$900-\$1,300 per month, including all meals and cleaning.
