## Why APPLY?

This program serves as an introduction to the college experience for recently graduated high school students.

Students selected to participate will be introduced to the skills necessary to be successful in college and will receive individualized support in adjusting to the college environment.

Through this program, students can better understand the necessary transition from high school to college.

## How do I qualify?

### All applicants must have:

- Graduated high school by May 2011
- ACT Composite score of 21 or less
- ACT Reading score of 18 or less
- ACT English score of 18 or less
- ACT Math score of 19 or less
- An acceptance letter from UALR

### Also, students must also be:

- Considered **low-income** according to federal guidelines
  - **Note:** To verify low-income eligibility a current copy of a personal or parent/guardian's 2009 income tax return must be submitted with application.

OR

- A **first-generation college student**, meaning neither parent completed a 4-year degree.

OR

- A student with a **disability**.
