

Minor in Art: Studio Art



The minor in Studio Art offers a strong foundational knowledge in art-making skills and processes, along with an introduction to a range of studio art disciplines.

A minor in Studio Art consists of **15 hours** in studio art courses, including:

ARST 1310: Basic Drawing & ARST 1315: 2-Dimensional Design

After completing ARST 1310 & 1315, students will choose **one** of the following:

ARST 2310: Figure Drawing

or

ARST 2318: Computer Applications in Art

or

ARST 2315: 3-Dimensional Design

To complete the minor in Studio Art, students will then select **two** upper-level courses for which the 2000-level prerequisite is complete. These hours may be in one discipline (e.g. Painting) or more than one discipline (e.g. Intro to Painting and Intro to Ceramics or Intro to Photography and Intro to Printmaking).



For BA in Art: Art History Track majors:

Since ARST 1310, 1315 and 2315 are included in the art history major, BA in Art: Art History majors, minoring in studio art, must take:

ARST 2310: Figure Drawing

Then select **one** upper-level studio art course for which they have the appropriate prerequisite, for example Intro to Painting, Intro to Ceramics, and Intro to Printmaking.
