

Minor in Art: Applied Design



The minor in Applied Design offers a study of traditional craft practices as well as contemporary trends in the field of studio craft. Through research, technical exercises, finished projects, discussions, and critiques, students will practice the skill of concept development, design, craftsmanship and critical evaluation for utilitarian as well as sculptural works.

The minor in Applied Design consists of **15 hours**, including:

ARST 2315: 3-Dimensional Design

and

ARST 3312: Contemporary Craft

After completing ARST 2315 & 3312 students select one discipline from either Furniture Design & Woodworking, Metalsmithing & Jewelry, or Ceramics, and chose **one** course from:

ARAD 3310: Introduction to Furniture Design

or

ARAD 3320: Introduction to Jewelry & Metalsmithing

or

ARAD 3350: Introduction to Ceramics

After completing the intro level course in the chosen discipline, students need to complete **two** more advanced courses from the same discipline.

Note that most courses beyond the Intro level have specific pre-requisites that will have to be satisfied before enrollment.
