

Copyright and Permissions

UALR Center for Arkansas History and Culture holds copyright to some, but not all, of its materials. As such, the Center can only grant or deny permission to use or publish materials to which it holds the copyright. Public Domain and Fair Use

UALR Center for Arkansas History and Culture welcomes you to use materials in the public domain and to make fair use of copyrighted materials as defined by copyright law.

Public Domain: You do not need to obtain permission to use materials in the public domain. Cornell University publishes a [chart](#) that may help identify what is and is not in the public domain in the United States.

Fair Use: The United States copyright law contains an exception for fair use of copyrighted materials, which includes the use of protected materials for certain purposes of teaching, scholarship, research, criticism, commentary, and news reporting. For guidelines on the fair use exception, please refer to the [United States Copyright Office](#). You are solely responsible for determining whether your use is fair and for responding to any claims that may arise from your use.

Commercial Use

If you wish to use any copyrighted materials for commercial use or any purpose other than fair use as defined by law, you must request and receive prior written permission for your intended use from the copyright holder. As mentioned above, UALR Center for Arkansas History and Culture has been assigned copyright for some collections. Obtain permission for commercial use or any other use of these specific materials that is not fair use as defined by law by submitting this [form](#). Permission is granted on a case-by-case basis at the sole discretion of UALR Center for Arkansas History and Culture.
