

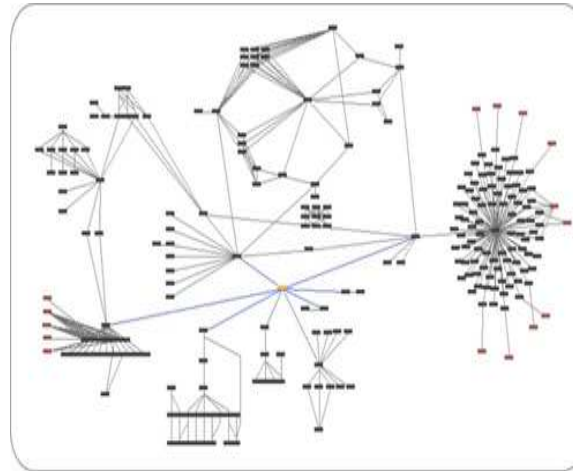
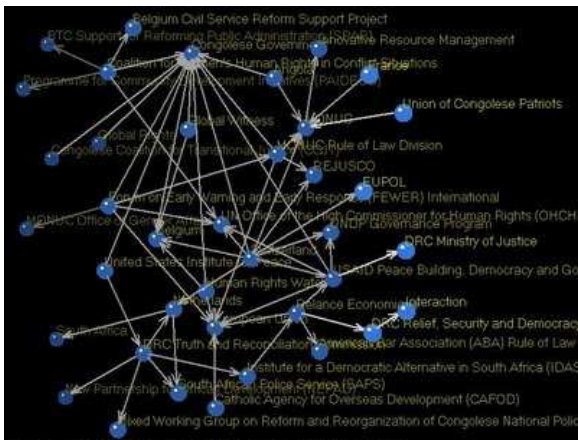
## INTERNSHIP PROGRAM GOALS AND PLEDGE

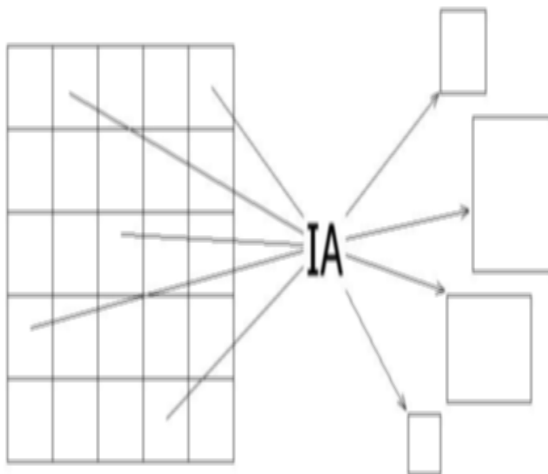

## How, When, & Where do I Apply?

**Apply early**, at least 3-6 months before Semester you wish to intern for.

## What Class do I register for and how many times can I take it?

*CRJU 3348—Internship can be taken 2-times for 3-hours elective academic credit.*

*CRJU 4333—Cooperative Education in Criminal Justice (Prior Approval-Only)*

## How many hours of work are required at an assigned Agency—Company?

*160 to 192 hours over a 16-week Fall or Spring Semester (10-12 hours Wk.)*

## What are eligibility requirements?

*2.75 GPA. Competitive selection processes apply. Most require some form of background check involving: criminal records, references, fingerprinting, drug screens, and credit checks, etc.*

## Any other requirements?

*No Examinations, Bi-Weekly Communication, Journal, Course Project, and end of term Performance Evaluation.*
