A. Wright resumed the motion. He asked R. Cheatham (chair of P&F) whether the committee intended to modify Goal 3, Objective 2, Strategy 1 with the intent of getting rid of centers and institutes.

R. Cheatham responded that "Centers of Excellence" is a specific term and the committee did not intend to eliminate centers and institutes.

A. Wright asked if an amendment to include "centers and institutes" would be acceptable and

accepted the amendment without objection when it was made.

A. Wright asked if the committee intended to broaden the intramural program from athletics to other things.

R. Cheatham responded that that was the committee's intent.

R. Cheatham made a motion to amend on behalf of the P&F committee and A. Wright accepted the amendment without objection: Amend Goal 3, Objective 2, Strategy 3: Replace "implement" with "continue and enhance."

A. Wright proceeded seriatim through the motion for discussion and amendment. No discussion occurred until Goal 5, Objective 2.

BBKnabe: Who is included in Objective 2?

J Hendon explains

J Vanderputten: recommends that we review federal definitions.

J H: S & M are underrepresented thus we included them specifically. Suggests we all review our affirmative action plan.

J Matson: Can we say we will continue to support affirmative action?

JH: We may but it is not necessary.

E Anson: moves to amend to accommodate the changes.

A Wright: calls the vote

## VII. New Business

**A. Motion FS\_2017\_11.** Executive Committee. (Legislation. Majority Vote at One Meeting, no second required) Attendance Policy (underline indicates addition, strikethrough indicates deletion)

**Be it resolved** to adopt the Attendance Policy to replace Policy 404.4,

### **Class Attendance and Withdrawal**

Each course instructor has the prerogative of setting specific attendance requirements for his or her courses. The course attendance policies must be stated in the course syllabus. In some

courses, active student participation is an integral part of the course, and the instructor may base a portion of the student's grades on attendance and participation. In general, students are expected to attend class regularly and complete all assignments and examinations. Students who miss class are responsible for finding out about the material covered, homework assignments, and any announcements or examinations.

Instructors are not required to adjust their class attendance policies nor to provide make-up exams to accommodate personal student travel, family or employment activities. The instructor has discretion to allow a student to make up work that is missed.

**And be it resolved** to move drop date legislation from 404.11 to 404.4 and to modify that legislation as follows

### **Withdrawing from an Individual Course (Drop Date)**

A student can drop a course up to the 5th day of classes through the schedule change process. Dropping a course in this time period will not result in a record of the drop on the student's transcript. From the 6th day through the 41st day of classes, a student wishing to drop a class submits a request to the Office of Records and Registration. A student cannot withdraw from a course after the 41st day of classes, except as noted below. The cut-off dates in this paragraph refer to the day of classes in a 15-week semester (five days=one week). In shorter semesters the cut-off dates will be adjusted proportionately.

**And be it resolved** to add withdrawal for non-attendance, non-payment, or emergency,

On or before the 10th day of classes, students who have not attended class or who have not met their payment obligations will be administratively withdrawn.

Students may be withdrawn from a class by the instructor at any time during the semester due to extenuating circumstances, such as medical or family emergencies or excessive absences. Students must be notified that they will be withdrawn from a class, and may appeal that action through the grade appeal process, provided that they file the appeal within five business days of the notice. The withdrawal will not be final until the appeal is completed, and students may continue to participate until the final decision is made.

**And be it resolved** to add withdrawal from the university,

### **Withdrawal from UA Little Rock**

Students voluntarily withdrawing from UA Little Rock must complete the University Withdrawal Form and have an exit interview with a staff member in the office responsible for financial aid if the student is receiving financial aid. The last day to officially withdraw from the university without a grade penalty will be set by the Registrar.

**And be it resolved** to add the citation and modification clause,

### **Citation and Modification**

This policy must be cited in any curricular documents that excerpt it (such as the Undergraduate Catalog) and the Faculty Senate Executive Committee (or their designee) should review those documents before they are finalized. Wherever there is a substantive conflict between the document which quotes this policy and this policy, this policy shall be followed.

The Policy can be modified through legislative action of the Faculty Senate (see Article III of the Constitution of the Assembly of the University of Arkansas at Little Rock).

**Commentary:** Policies 501.12, 508.5, and 512.4 cite some withdrawal language as part of the

policy. These policies should be rewritten to reference this policy, so that it is clear what the rules are and so that modifications to these rules do not put the multiple policies out of synchronization. The reason for adopting this policy relates to the federal compliance review. Institutions are required to have an attendance policy adopted by the faculty.

The withdrawal for non-attendance is necessary to be compliant with the use of Title IV funds, and the other withdrawal options in that clause relate to current practice of withdrawal for non-payment and administrative withdrawal.

The withdrawal from the university had been board policy; however, that policy/memorandum has disappeared. It is necessary to authorize this type of withdrawal so that the practice can continue.

A Wright: introduces the motion and explains the rationale. Title IV requires that we have some attendance policy. Federal govt is using accrediting bodies (HLC) to enforce this requirement through the accreditation visit. Since we're coming to a visit, we need to put this in place. The goal of this motion is to add policy that conforms closely to current practice. To the best of my knowledge, the only policy change is under the extenuating circumstances withdrawal, where current practice is to have chairs and deans able to remove students without the instructor's knowledge or approval.

E Anson: Points out typo [corrected above]

Q? Define withdrawal from University as withdrawal from all classes in a term

Discussion of definition, history of withdrawal.

AW: Suggest we continue with current practice and consider carefully any changes needed and that we will be bringing amendments to address senators' concerns in the next academic year.

R Cheatham: Suggest we delete reference to exact policy number.

RC: How about policy name and number for the time being?

AW: Okay

J Flinn: Because of the need for student travel by athletes, academic competition and other university business, add 'personal' to this line: ...exams to accommodate personal student travel, family or employment activities. The,,, under **Class Attendance and Withdrawal**.

Motion carries.

**B. Motion FS\_2017\_13.** Executive Committee. (Legislation. Majority Vote at One Meeting, no second required) Limits on Credit earned by Placement and Standardized tests

Be it resolved to modify Policy 517.1 as follows (underline indicates addition, strikethrough indicates deletion)

**D-Course Transfer Policy**

UA Little Rock will grant academic credit for courses transferred from a regionally accredited college or university if a grade of A, B, or C was earned at the transferring institution  
~~A student may transfer as many as six credit hours with a grade of "D" from any accredited college or university. Credit for the hours will be accepted as transfer credit if the course meets requirements for transfer course credit and if a student would be allowed to earn a the same grade of "D" if the class were offered at UA Little Rock.~~ UALR. A student may take advantage of this policy only once and at any

time prior to the awarding of an undergraduate degree. If the student does not choose to transfer the maximum of six hours at that time, any remaining hours will not be accepted in transfer.

~~Designated University College advisers and one adviser per academic college will be authorized to approve the “D” transfer form. Once approved, the form will be sent to Records and Registration for processing.~~

And be it further resolved to modify Policy 517.1 as follows (underline indicates addition, strikethrough indicates deletion)

### **Credit by Examination**

UA Little Rock may award course credit for standardized tests, such as AP, IB, ACT, SAT, Accuplacer, CLEP, and departmentally created examinations. The courses for which such credit, placement, or exemption shall be granted and the grade (credit/no credit or letter grade) which is assigned based on the tests will be determined by the department/program faculty, by submitting a request through the curriculum process to Undergraduate Council. The information in the approved request will be published in the UA Little Rock Undergraduate Catalog, placed on the UA Little Rock website, and available at the appropriate offices within the university.

Course credit from examinations will not count towards the ~~minimum hours to graduate, residency requirements, upper level hour requirements, or gpa~~ calculation. A maximum of 30 hours may be awarded for all forms of Credit by Examination. Because there are a variety of ways whereby a student may achieve credit for a specific course (for instance, IB, AP, CLEP, placement test, concurrent, transfer course, UALR course), under no circumstances should a student receive multiple credits for the same course.

### **AP Credit**

UALR will award some level of credit, placement, or exemption for AP examination scores of 3 or higher. UALR may award some level of credit, placement, or exemption for AP examination scores of 2 or lower.

The request to Undergraduate Council should include name of the examination, the corresponding UA Little Rock course(s), and the amount of credit awarded for acceptable scores on the examination.

~~The UALR department or program that offers courses/credits having content that is the most similar to the content covered by a particular AP examination will determine the specific level of credit, placement, or exemption granted for particular scores on that particular AP examination, consistent with all university-wide policies. UALR departments and programs will review their AP examination credit, placement, and exemption policies annually. Changes to UALR AP~~



~~examination credit, placement, and exemption policies should be made by submitting the appropriate curriculum change form to the UALR Undergraduate Council.~~

~~UALR will clearly communicate its policies and acceptance of AP examinations by providing the following information: the name of the AP examination, the corresponding UALR course(s), and the amount of credit awarded for acceptable scores on the examination. This information will be published in the UALR Undergraduate Catalog, placed on the UALR website, and available at the appropriate offices within the University.~~

### **Standardized Tests for Credit**

~~Students are allowed to take standardized subject matter tests for credit. Such tests will be adopted by the department/program offering the course. The courses for which such credit shall be granted and the grade (credit/no credit or letter grade) which is assigned based on the tests will be determined solely by the department/program faculty.~~

### **Standardized Placement Tests**

~~Departments/programs UA Little Rock may authorize credit/placement for a course having similar content to the content covered by a subsection of a standardized placement test such as ACT, SAT, or Accuplacer by submitting the request to the Undergraduate Council. The request to Undergraduate Council should include the name of the test, the subsection, the minimum score on the subsection, and the course number for which credit will be given. Course credit from standardized tests will not count towards the minimum hours to graduate, residency requirements, upper level hour requirements, or gpa calculation.~~

### **International Baccalaureate**

~~At least twenty-four (24) semester credit hours or equivalent undergraduate course credit shall be granted entering freshman to students who have successfully completed the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IB). Specific credit to be awarded shall be determined within existing guidelines.~~

~~If the student's IB curriculum has a subject at the Standard Level, and, by means other than the IB, the student gains credit for a UA Little Rock course that is mapped to the same subject at the Higher Level, then such credit does not count toward the minimum 24 credits granted for the IB.~~

~~Because UA Little Rock awards a minimum of 24 credits when it accepts the IB diploma, any extra credits that are not assigned to specific UA Little Rock courses by other means shall be awarded as general lower level elective credit.~~

A Wright: Explains the motions. When we passed modifications to the placement and transfer credit policy earlier this academic year, I had indicated that we could bring back the policy to the senate and try to put the common language for credit by examination into a header to unify practice and simplify the policy. I had also indicated that we would look at a maximum on credits by examination.

R Cheatham moves to restore the language "A student may transfer as many as six

credit hours with a grade of “D” from any accredited college or university. A student may take advantage of this policy only once and at any time prior to the awarding of an undergraduate degree. If the student does not choose to transfer the maximum of six hours at that time, any remaining hours will not be accepted in transfer.

Designated University College advisers and one adviser per academic college will be authorized to approve the “D” transfer form. Once approved, the form will be sent to Records and Registration for processing.”

AW: calls vote on amendment. Amendment fails 12 to 12.

E Anson: move that “a regionally” be added to this line: “UA Little Rock will grant academic credit for courses transferred from a regionally accredited college or university if a grade of A, B, C or credit was earned at the transferring institution.”

A. Wright accepted without objection.

J Giammo: Moves to strike wording in **Credit by Examination: Course credit from examinations will not count towards the minimum hours to graduate, residency requirements, upper level hour requirements, or gpa calculation.**

E Anson: seconds

Amendment carries on voice vote.

There was discussion on the 30 hour limit on credit by examination.

N. Jovanovic: there may be a limit in HLC guidelines. Not sure.

A. Wright: 30 credit hours is 2 semesters of 15 credit hours. Seems reasonable.

Motion carries on voice vote.

**C. Motion FS\_2017\_14. Graduate Council** (Legislation. Majority Vote at One Meeting, no second required) Clarification on Early Entry Program (underline indicates addition, strikethrough indicates deletion) (pending action by GC on Wednesday)

**Be it resolved** to modify the Graduate Credit Earned by Undergraduates legislation (FS\_2014\_6) to change the name of the program from “4+1 program” to “Early Entry Graduate Program” throughout the policy,

**And be it resolved** to modify “graduate degree” to “graduate degree/certificate” throughout the Early Entry Graduate Program section of the policy.

B Berry: Explains motion

N Jovanovic: Explains origination of this motion. Concerned about a certificate being awarded before undergraduate degree is awarded.

B Berry: Believes there legislative language to address this.

A Wright: Searches for language and finds it -

Calls vote: Motion carries.

**E. Motion FS\_2017\_15. Graduate Council** (Legislation. Majority Vote at One Meeting, no second required) Double-counting Policy

**Be it resolved** to adopt the Double Counting of Graduate Credits Policy,

***Policy for Double Counting of UA Little Rock Graduate Credits***

This policy applies only to graduate degrees awarded solely at UA Little Rock. Other dual degree programs involving UA Little Rock and other campuses are not subject to this policy.

***TYPE OF DEGREE***

***Two Graduate Degrees in Distinct Disciplines (as determined by the program)***

No more than 12 graded semester credit hours (research hours will not be double-counted), subject to the following conditions:

- o Both degrees are completed within the time allowed.
- o Written approval of both graduate program coordinators.
- o Written approval of the Graduate School Dean.

***Master's or Specialist's Degree en route to Doctorate in the Same Discipline***

Upon recommendation by the graduate program, a doctoral candidate may earn a master's or specialist's degree in the same discipline, upon completion of the master's or specialist's degree requirements or upon the completion of specific requirements established by the program. The master's or specialist's degree may not be awarded retroactively. The candidate must apply for graduation by the appropriate deadline.

If a student has earned a master's or specialist's degree in the same discipline from another university, the student will not be awarded another equivalent master's or specialist's degree from UA Little Rock.

***Completed Master's or Specialist's Degree and Doctoral Degree***

All graded semester credit hours (research hours will not be double-counted) earned from a master's or specialist's degree awarded by UA Little Rock within the past seven years may be double-counted towards a doctoral degree. Policy is at the discretion of each graduate program. If either program prohibits double-counting, the prohibition applies to the other program as well. Contact the programs for more information.

***Completed Graduate Certificate and Graduate Degree***

All graded semester credit hours (research hours will not be double-counted) earned from a graduate certificate awarded by UA Little Rock within the past seven years may be double-counted towards a higher degree. Policy is at the discretion of each graduate program. If either program prohibits double-counting, the prohibition applies to the other program as well. Contact the programs for more information.

***Two Graduate Certificates***

Double-counting is not allowed.

**F.** Motion FS\_2017\_18. Graduate Council (Legislation. Majority Vote at One Meeting, no second required) Academic Clemency (Graduate)

**Be it resolved** to adopt the Academic Clemency (Graduate) policy  
**Policy for Academic Clemency for Graduate Students**

Any graduate student who has previously attended UA Little Rock and whose attendance at UA Little Rock or any institution of higher education has been interrupted for a period of at least two years may qualify for academic clemency providing he or she meets all of the criteria specified below and was not dismissed for non-academic reasons. Under this policy a graduate student may apply to have graduate grades and credits earned at UA Little Rock previous to the separation removed from his or her grade point average. Approval of a request for clemency requires the signature of the student's Program Coordinator and the Graduate School Dean.

After re-entering UA Little Rock following a separation of at least two years from any institution of higher education, a graduate student may request academic clemency at the Graduate School. The student shall specify the term(s) for which clemency is desired. The request will be forwarded, along with appropriate permanent record information, to the student's Program Coordinator for approval. The coordinator shall forward the request to the Graduate School Dean.

Clemency shall cover all credits earned during the semesters (i.e. Spring, Summer, Fall) for which clemency is requested. A student may request clemency for up to two entire semesters. The student's complete record will remain on the transcript with the added notation of academic clemency received.

Any petition for academic clemency must be requested and granted prior to the awarding of a

degree. Once the degree is awarded, the record is closed and the academic clemency policy cannot be invoked.

Academic clemency may be approved only once. For purposes of degree requirements, a student who receives clemency must follow the provisions of the Graduate Catalog in effect at the time of re-enrollment.
