- 2. Humanities Core Course Review
 - a. Mythology numbers improve each semester
 - b. Ethics and Society for Engineering
 - i. First time taught was Fall 2016
 - ii. Enrollment was low and the class offering was shifted to once a year in the spring
 - iii. No issues with core assessment
 - iv. Non-engineering students do take the course
 - c. World Religions
 - i. It is hard for a face to face section to make
 - ii. Movement to online has improved enrollment
 - d. Adjuncts
 - i. Three to four sections of core humanities may be cut if adjuncts are eliminated
 - ii. Will students shift to other core classes if this happens when we reduce sections of core classes

- 1. Core Council can help provide some of these numbers
- 2. We won't know the outcome of these reductions until Fall 2019
- iii. Departments in the Humanities CAAC have to maintain constant contact with the concurrent instructors in the high school in order for concurrent to be successful
 - 1. The English department did a workshop over the summer on technology with concurrent instructors
- iv. Humanities CAAC can use assessment data to revise goals and propose these revisions to senate if needed
- v. The Humanities CAAC wants more collaborative work with other CAACs and the core council
 - 1. Other CAACs have also stated this
- vi. One issue was having to access multiple things during one assessment cycle
 - 1. There was a suggestion of moving to a three year cycle
- vii. CALS 2370 may be suspended
