The graduate clemency policy was referred to the Graduate Council Policy & Personnel Subcommittee for consideration of issues programs have had recently.

Dr. Berry reported on enrollment trends within the Graduate School based on Trojan Fact Explorer. Overall, enrollment has declined in the several years, but experienced a slight increase since Fall 2021. He also reported that SSCHs are up, which means the students enrolled are taking more hours. Online SSCHs are increasing, while main-campus are decreasing.

Dr. Berry also reported that the University budget decisions reflect this decline. We need to stabilize enrollment or find ways to increase it. He then reported on groupings of programs within colleges and trends in enrollment within these programs.

<u>4/13/22:</u>

Dr. Berry reported about the Graduate Get Your Feet Wet scholarship, aimed at students on the fence about going to grad school because of a financial barrier. The scholarship pays for 1 course. There were 23 awards given out this year in the spring and fall semesters. The scholarship will be continued next year with a doubled budget. We will begin accepting Fall 2022 applications for this award in May.

Dr. Kuralt reported on the Student Success Office and the student retention initiative peer mentor positions now available for grad students as well as undergrads. The deadline to apply is April 15, 2022. Please email: studentsucess@ualr.edu for more information.

Also discussed at this meeting was the need for a code of conduct for theses and dissertation students and their committees in case of substantial conflicts. The Graduate School is working on finishing a revision of the Graduate Student Handbook, which can include such a code of conduct. The Graduate School will work with the Graduate Council on this matter.

<u>4/27/22:</u>

Dr. Berry thanked the Graduate Council and the subcommittee chairs for their hard work this year. Additionally he thanked Karen Kuralt and Paula Baker-Rouse in the graduate school for their hard work this year.

This summer Dr. Berry and Dr. Kuralt will be reviewing the Graduate School policies this summer and will report back to the Graduate Council about their findings. Dr. Berry also gave updates on the strategic planning of the university. There are 3 strategic planning groups: 1) Institutional wide- led by the Chancellor, 2) Academic group- run by the Provost, and 3) Research strategic planning- led by Dr. Berry. These are in the early stages of the planning right now. Later, they will share the draft plans for feedback from the larger university community.
