Deans' Report

2/7/24

Dr. Berry discussed the most recent enrollment report, which shows a significantly lower number of applications for Spring 2024 compared to Spring 2023. He attributed the decrease to the Graduate School having cleared out a significant number of deferred applications from COVID. These students were admitted, but were unable to get here due to the pandemic, so their applications remained in the system. Dr. Berry noted that admissions numbers did not decrease to the same extent.

Dr. Berry discussed progress on Workday Student Testing. Dr. Berry, Dr. Kuralt, Paula Baker-Rouse, and Lucas Crosland have represented the Grad School in the latest round of testing. The date for Workday Student to go live is currently projected to be August 2024; students will begin registering in Workday in 2025. Advising in Workday will begin in Spring 2025. Starting in Fall 2025, all student records (including those previously contained in DegreeWorks) will be migrated to Workday, and instructors will be starting grade input via Workday that same semester. Dr. Kuralt announced that the Graduate School awarded 13 recruiting grants to programs who applied for recruiting help last semester.

The Grad School also awarded 23 "Get Your Feet Wet" scholarships to incoming students for Spring 2024.

Dr. Kuralt also announced that this year's Grad School Night at Trojan Baseball will be held on Tuesday, April 30 when UA Little Rock faces off against UCA. All current grad and undergrad students are invited to watch the game and enter to win door prizes to celebrate the end of the semester, and undergrads are encouraged to visit information tables at the event to learn more about our grad programs.
