Presentation on Quality Initiatives Project, Dr. Amanda Nolen and Dr. Joanne Matson

Dr. Matson:

- The Quality Initiatives Project (QIP) began in October, and is entirely unrelated to restructuring.
- QIP seeks to modernize and centralize UALR's data collecting and sharing, with the ultimate goal of improving data collection and usage on campus. This will be a years-long process.
- Long-term Plan:
 - o Get data warehouse and store UALR data there, starting with small data and moving up.
 - The warehouse will house all institutional data from all systems.
 - The goal is to have a system where data is available to everyone in a dashboard, accessible from your desk.
- Three groups are working on the project:
 - Metrics group, chaired by Dr. Matson
 - Systems group, chaired by Nathan Nolen
 - Analytics group, Dr. Amanda Nolen
- Better data collection will be crucial for determining both success rates and causes of loss of retention/enrollment.

Dr. Nolen:

- The analytics group has been investigating different dashboard models. Cornell's and UTS's are very interactive and easy to use.
- The hope is to make the UALR data dashboard similarly interactive and user-friendly.

GC Input:

- In response to Dr. Yupo Chan's query, Dr. Nolan said that this project will help make accreditation much easier and Higher Learning Commission assessments smoother
- Recommends seeing Draft Metrics List for more details.

- A Data Governance document is being drafted, with the intention of promoting data integrity. If this project can get data integrity regulated, it will be considered a success.
- Dr. Chan suggests that we be wary of survey data, focusing instead on objectively verifiable data. Dr. Nolen and Dr. Matson agree.
- Dr. Kent Layton recommends that when defining data report terms, they start with the nonnegotiable state and federal terms, for greatest consistency and accuracy.

Dr. Nolen and Dr. Matson invite any additional GC questions and comments via email.
