Open Forum

• Clemency Policy Discussion

The committee discussed a student example.

The student had completed 2 semesters. They received two C's, B's, and an A. When they got the "B" they were dismissed. To come back to UA Little Rock, the student has to get rid of their C's. This student has no record of D's or F's.

Question: How should this case be handled?

Answer: The student will have to abide by the current Clemency Policy.

This scenario conflicts with two policy issues (recently worked on by the committee).

The Clemency Policy was passed by the Senate.

Based on these policies, the student will have to wipe out a whole semester before they can be readmitted to the university. The student cannot "Take and Replace" because they have been dismissed. Discussed if the student should take classes and pay for them out of pocket until they can gain readmission.

The committee agreed that they may need to modify policies in the future if more situations like this occur. This example brought to the committee is a case that currently isn't covered by both of the recently passed policies. The committee suggested that they will have to think about ways to avoid potential pitfalls like this.

The Graduate Council agreed that if they make changes to the Senate now, that it could raise flags and show weaknesses in their recently modified and approved policies.

Currently, the committee has a good record and standing with Faculty Senate.

• 509.11 Graduation Requirements and 509.12 Leave of Absence Revisions Both of these policy revisions didn't make it to the last agenda of the Faculty Senate. However, they are first up on the agenda for their August meeting.

The committee consulted on ways to make the policies more procedural. Discussion occurred about how they can prepare for the August meeting. All agreed that they need to be ready to answer any questions that the Senate may have.

There was a discussion about starting a form in Argos to be used as a guide for faculty.

• Final Meeting

The committee agreed that no more meetings will need to be held this semester. The next meeting will be in August (Fall semester).
