Dean's Report

HLC Visit

- HLC visit is over.
- o Dr. Berry appreciates all of the open forum and discussion attendees.
- HLC visitors were happy with the engagements that took place.
- Overall, the forums were positive. This is a morale booster to the university.
- Concern about only one forum.

APPROVED

- There is a great appreciation of the evidence notated in the documents.
- Everything appears to be going well.

HLC Formal Response

- The university should be getting a draft from the HLC visit in a couple of weeks.
- Draft will give the university a chance to address any errors of fact, but cannot address any areas of opinion.
- The official document will not be completed until the summer.

Enrollment Tracking

- Fall applicants are down 3%.
- Domestic Students are up 8%.
- Graduate Students entering with a degree are up 26.5%.
- International Students are down 33%.
 - Some of the factors due to these percentages are beyond our control on campus. Example: economic issues.
- Will be working towards using Keystone to help target international students. This will help to get university information on websites.
- Waiver codes are being used to track students/applications.
- Dr. Berry would like to work on getting enrollment numbers up.
- New and different marketing strategies are being explored to raise numbers.

Open Forum

GSA Events

- Natalie Snow has been working hard to revive the GSA Program on campus.
- First GSA event gave out 59 tickets
- There were new members at the last GSA meeting.
- Encourage students to join. This organization advocates on behalf of the wellbeing of Graduate students.
- Some upcoming events:
 - Lunch 'n Learn CV vs Resume (March 4, 12PM-1PM)
 - Hosted by a panel of UA Little Rock faculty members, including Dr. Kuralt.

- Lunch 'n Learn Entering the Academic Workforce Event (March 5, 11AM-12PM)
 - Hosted by a panel of UA Little Rock faculty members.
- All events have a Google Meet. All students need to do is notify GSA that they
 want to be added. This Google Meet is monitored so students can ask questions
 and participate.
 - Committee suggested that GSA looks into software that records the meetings/events so students can access them at a different time.
- Working on an online video about the organization. Video is being edited and should be done soon.

• HLC Concerns From Committee Members

- Committee members were concerned about how information will be ratified for and to administration. Concerned about the timeline aspect.
- Notified that actions will take place in two phases.
 - Identification of programs and personnel decisions will take place in March.
 - Final approval will take place in May.
- Policies everyone should read: <u>620.1</u>, <u>405.59</u>, and <u>405.4</u>.
 - Knowing this content will help with comforting people.
- Discussion about policy 405.1.
- Decisions will not go into effect until the fall. Currently, there are some gray areas in the policy that are being discussed. There is work going on behind the scenes on how to ethically and legally address these areas. The silence is not an effort to not tell, but it is due to figuring out how to address these unanswered questions.
- Dr. Berry understands the concerns of the committee members and acknowledges that this is going to be a painful and anxious time.
- Concerns about losing new hires on tenure track were discussed. Individuals will be notified.
- Speculations were addressed based on the lack of communication and comforting/words of reassurance.
- On the positive spectrum of things, Dr. Berry commented that there are ways to look into the gray and find comfort. He reassures everyone that there will be an exit plan/strategy instead of just letting people go.
- Questions were brought to attention about the communication process related to the aftermath of the HLC visit.
 - Currently, there is no process. There is a lot of vetting due to the words that need to be said.
 - The parties/faculty involved are trying to figure out how to deliver this news. They do not want to deliver it poorly.

- There is a fear of cutting some of the most promising and talented people at the university.
- Dr. Berry thinks/hopes that UA Little Rock comes out as a healthier and better institution in the end. He hopes the outcomes will help the college in a positive way. Overall, he just wants the institution to thrive.
