Dean's Report

• Concerns about COVID-19

- Dr. Berry wants everyone to make sure to watch their emails. This method of communication will provide instruction pertaining to the virus.
- Currently working on a contingency plan.
- Working from home may become a possibility. Coordinators should prepare themselves to work remotely.
- o During this time, Dr. Berry needs coordinators to keep processing admits.
 - Admissions is currently driving the university's budget crisis.
 - To continue processing admits via Argos, coordinators will need access to UALR VPN.
 - The UALR VPN cannot handle very many people. There will be a list created for VPN access. The VPN should only be used for Argos and ImageNow.
 - VPN 'How to' documentation is in the works of being created.
 - Dr. Berry reassures council members that it is easy to download a VPN.

• Admissions Department will still be operating

- Dr. Berry doesn't want to stop admits and applications because we are moving up from last year's application numbers.
- The university has to keep converting admits to being fully enrolled students.

• Student Research Expo

- o Currently, the Student Research Expo event is a little up in the air.
- Due to COVID-19, the expo would be a prime environment for transmission.
- If the university shuts down, there is an app that can be used to make the in-person event a virtual event.
- "There is a silver lining in every cloud," Dr. Berry said regarding the Student Research Expo situation.

Open Forum

• Program Code Adjustment To Get Into Sync With ADHE Reporting

- Malissa Mathis and Dana Steele (Records and Registration) discussed the Program Code Adjustment To Get Into Sync With ADHE Reporting document (see handout).
- The goal is to clean up coding going on in the background.
- The university can only report one degree to the state. Concentrations are not on a student's diploma. However, concentrations appear on a student's official transcript.
- Currently, when a student is applying for graduation, they apply for multiple degrees instead of one.
- With this code clean up, instead of one degree and one concentration, there will be one degree program and an umbrella of concentrations.
 - This will allow all degrees to be reported to the state.
- Question: Will coordinators see any difference?
 - Answer: You will see some small change in the program number. There will be some minor changes in attaching concentrations. Records and Registration will be working with the Graduate School during this transition.

Next Meeting

- The next Graduate Council meeting will be on April 1, 2020.
 - This date may change if the campus closes.
 - Might hold the meeting virtually and be able to have electronic votes.
 - Will need to consult with the Faculty Senate about making this decision.
 - Would potentially use Google Hangouts, Zoom, or any other software to host the next meeting if it is remotely.
