



Little Rock Congregations Study Frequently Asked Questions



Nope. You have lots of options! You can take the survey on your phone, on a tablet, or on a computer. If you don't want to or are not able to take the survey electronically, just let your congregation leader know and we will get you a paper survey.

How long does the survey take?

The survey only takes about 10-15 minutes to complete. And the questions are so interesting, the time will fly by!

Every participating place of worship will receive a link that is unique to just their congregation. This link will be distributed by the leadership of each congregation through email, on the congregation's Facebook page, or in a bulletin or newsletter. If you can't find your congregation's survey link, just ask someone in leadership, or the UA Little Rock student who is helping your congregation with the survey.

Do I have to take the survey on a computer?

Is the survey available in Spanish?

Yes! You can take the survey in Spanish. Just click the dropdown menu in the top right corner and select Spanish (Español--America Latina) to take the survey in Spanish. ¡Si! Puede realizar la encuesta en español. Simplemente haga clic en el menú desplegable en la esquina superior derecha y seleccione Español--Latinoamerica para realizar la encuesta en español.

Where do I go to fill out the survey?

Absolutely not! The students and faculty at UA Little Rock are administering the electronic survey and compiling a report for your congregation at no charge because we believe in the benefits of community-engaged research and want to give back.

Does it cost anything for my congregation to participate?

We hope that you and your congregation will see at least four benefits from participating:

- You get to tell the leaders of your congregation about what matters most to you.
- Your responses help our research team put together a report for your leaders. The report will include opportunities to connect with other congregations and nonprofits in Little Rock to work on community issues that matter to your congregation.
- You help UA Little Rock students learn beyond the classroom through a community experience they will never forget.
- You will help researchers better understand the impact of communities of faith in Little Rock.
