13th Annual Racial Attitudes in Pulaski County Survey Focus on Immigration
Questionnaire & Percent Frequencies

The Racial Attitudes in Pulaski County survey was conducted by the UALR Survey Research Center (SRC) between September 11 and December 13, 2015. A total of 2,064 interviews were conducted with a stratified random sample of residents, 18 years of age and older in Pulaski County, Arkansas. The study focuses on black, white, and Hispanic relations, the data analysis is divided into five groups: LR-blacks; LR-whites; OLR-blacks; and, OLR-whites and Hispanics with a total of 1,992 respondents.

The following is a presentation of each question used in the Racial Attitudes survey and the percentage frequencies for each of the response categories. Unless otherwise noted the total for each geo-racial group is:
