15th Annual Racial Attitudes in Pulaski County Survey Focus on Education
Questionnaire & Percent Frequencies

The Racial Attitudes in Pulaski County survey was conducted by the UA Little Rock Survey Research Center (SRC) between August 31, 2017 and January 19, 2018. A total of 1,915 interviews were conducted with a stratified sample of residents, 18 years of age and older in Pulaski County, Arkansas. The study focuses on black, white, and Hispanic relations, the data analysis is divided into five groups: LR-blacks; LR-whites; OLR-blacks; and, OLR-whites and Hispanics with a total of 1,859 respondents.

The following is a presentation of each question used in the Racial Attitudes survey and the percentage frequencies for each of the response categories. Unless otherwise noted the total for each geo-racial group is:
